Additional Polling results

“Would you favor or oppose allowing gay couples to go a justice of the peace and get a marriage license?”

56% of married individuals support
61% of divorced/separated individuals support
79% of singles support

50% of Protestants support
55% of Catholics support
79% of individuals of other faiths support

56% of northern residents support
61% of western residents support
62% of center/lakes region residents support
60% of Hillsborough county residents support
63% of seacoast residents support

- Adults between 18 and 39 years old, those who were never married, those who are non-religious, those who have lived in New Hampshire between 3 to 5 years, and those who support abortion in all circumstances are most likely to support allowing gay couples to go to a justice of the peace for a marriage license.
- Males, adults 60 years old or older, Protestants, and those who support limited abortion or no abortion are most likely to oppose allowing gay couples to go to a justice of the peace for a marriage license.

“Would it bother you if gay couples could go to a justice of the peace and get a marriage license?”

72% of northern residents say No
69% of western residents say No
74% of center/lakes region residents say No
73% of Hillsborough county residents say No
73% of seacoast residents say No

60% of Protestants say No
72% of Catholics say No
86% of individuals of other faiths say No
Legal in all circumstances – Yes 11%, No 88%

- Adults between 18 and 29 years old, those who have lived in New Hampshire between 3 to 5 years, those who have never been married, those who are non-religious and those who support legal abortion in all circumstances are most likely to not be bothered.
- Males, adults 70 years old or older, those with a high school education or less, Protestants, and those who believe there should be no legal abortion are most likely to be bothered.
